Achievements

Professor Andre Luiten (Director, Institute for Photonics and Advanced Sensing) has been awarded the 2018 Australian Institute of Physics (AIP) Alan Walsh Medal for Service to Industry. This medal recognises Professor Luiten for his outstanding research in photonics and optics and for his exceptional leadership in commercialising breakthrough research to support industry needs. The medal was presented at the 23rd AIP Congress held in Perth last week.



Professor Derek Abbott (School of Electrical and Electronic Engineering) has won the 2019 M A Sargent Medal, awarded by <u>Engineers Australia</u>. It was awarded for Professor Abbott's significant contributions to science and engineering, including technical innovation and leadership, particularly for his pioneering research into terahertz radiation.



Clinical Associate Professor Andrew Kurmis (Adelaide Medical School) has been selected as the 2018 Australian Orthopaedic Association Trans-Tasman Fellow. He will represent Australia as the nominated envoy to the New Zealand Orthopaedic Association (NZOA).
